What 's been happening in our school this week....

Foundation: Children have been enjoying "The Little Red Hen"

Year 1: In our English lessons, we have been practising writing letters to Mother Goose from Twinkle Twinkle We needed to come up with a problem for Twinkle Twinkle which was that she was afraid of heights!

Year 2: Have been amazing at making coleslaw! They learnt safe ways for cutting with a knife, how to peel and grate carrot and how to maintain high levels of hygiene when preparing food. We have also been working hard on number bonds to ten and 100. Keep practising at home!

Year 3: In Maths we have been learning about column addition and subtraction. We have been using Base 10 equipment to practice how we organise and complete each calculation and we have very quickly remembered the rules to be successful using column methods. We must always start from the ones column and say top number subtract bottom number in subtraction. With addition we know that we must start with the ones, but we can add the digits in any order.

Year 4: In science, we concluded our tooth decay experiment. We were astonished to discover that Red Bull (energy drink) caused the most decay of the eggshell, but a close second was orange juice. The Red Bull had 11g of sugar per 100ml and the orange juice had 9.7g. These drinks had the highest sugar content of all the drinks we tested, and we have learned that we should avoid drinks which have a high sugar content. We also know that we must look after our teeth and brush them twice a day.
