What 's been happening in the classrooms this week....

Foundation - have started learning phonics this week! We have learnt m, a, s, t so far. The children are learning to listen carefully and repeat what they hear by responding to my turn, your turn actions.

We have also started reading We're Going on a Bear Hunt and are learning each part of the story. We had a long think about the problem they had and decided that when the family met the bear they were scared, but the bear just wanted to be friends with them! We have used our "mini-me's" to explore our Bear hunt 3d story map.

Year 1 – have been learning how to write questions so we decided to put our skills to the test by writing questions to Mrs Baptiste to help us learn a little more about her! We learnt that Mrs Baptiste's favourite food is chicken pie, when she was a teacher, she mostly taught foundation, year 1, 2 and 3, she is in her 40s and she lives near the lighthouse on the Hoe! We came up with the questions on our own and I think Mrs Baptiste wasn't too surprised about how younger children don't have any boundaries!!

Year 2 - had an exciting visit this week from two police officers. They learnt all about the special components of the uniform and why they need it.

Year 3 – In Science, they have been investigating different types of rock and their properties.

Year 4 - have been learning about the different types of teeth we have and their functions. They have also investigated animal's teeth and why they are different to ours.

Year 5 – have been learning about Roman numerals, Anglo-Saxon's timelines and have played Tennis in PE.

Year 6 - have written non-chronological reports on an animal of their choice. They have been focusing on keeping their information succinct and in a formal manner. In Maths, they have been revising formal methods and applying those skills in multi-step word problems. Mrs Bojang was very impressed with the children's arithmetic skills and their desire to learn and improve in this area. We particularly enjoyed looking at and designing our own Mayan masks – we are looking forward to developing these ideas further in the next few weeks.
