Foundation: This week we have been busy performing our Nativity as well as exploring the story of the Owl Babies.

<u>Year 1:</u> We went on a winter walk as part of our science lesson. We have just started learning about winter and we were looking out for the signs of this season. We saw berries, holly, warm clothing being worn, bare trees, evergreen trees, a robin, ice and lots of dead leaves on the ground. It was the perfect week to have carried out our walk because the temperature has really dropped!

<u>Year 3:</u> We have been working hard at answering multiplication and division problems. We have been using different methods to help us achieve the answer. This includes counting on our fingers, drawing bar models, number lines and arrays. We are becoming much more confident and it is lovely to see everyone using the school's value of 'resilience' in each lesson.

<u>Year 4:</u> In Year 4 science, we have investigated different types of manufactured switches and then we made our own switches which we then placed into a circuit. We tested which were easier to create a closed circuit, then an open circuit. We know that switches allow us to control the flow of electricity in a circuit.

Year 5: In Art, the Viking masks have now been painted using acrylic paint. In English, we have completed our writing unit, using our clay masks as the stimulus for writing instructions and an information text. In Maths our first fraction unit is complete – don't worry, 'Fractions 2' begins in the new year.

We really enjoyed performing our Christmas Play to you all!

<u>Year 6:</u> This week Y6 made me (and I'm sure all of you) very proud during their Christmas production - I saw some of you wiping tears away! In English, we have created Christmas Tales using a variety of prompt cards. This has given the children an opportunity to show off their writing skills, again making us very proud.
