<u>Foundation:</u> This week we have been continuing to challenge ourselves. We have been practising our cutting skills to pack a case with winter clothes suitable for our current frosty weather. We have just started our new story about Percy the park keeper's snowy night and talking about the problem in the story. This week's maths has been exploring counting within 10.

<u>Year 1:</u> Year 1 have recently started our first computing unit using the Chromebooks. We have been learning how to log on using our usernames and passwords and how to access Microsoft Office applications. We have been discussing how technology is used all around us - children came up with many examples of the technology in their lives. In our history lesson this week, we even drew on our knowledge of how technology has significantly developed over time when learning about Christopher Columbus.

<u>Year 2:</u> This week Year 2 took a walk to Efford Marsh. We were looking for real examples of things that were living, dead or have never been alive; this linked with our science work. The children were fantastic on their trip- it was their first ever school trip! Big well done to you all year 2!

<u>Year 3/4: This</u> week the children have been using an ancient Japanese method of stamp printing called Ukiyo-e. This is a style of painting created by Hokusai; the children made a stamp with a simple shape on using wool and cardboard. By the end of the term the children will be recreating The Great Wave by Hokusai.

<u>Year 5:</u> We have been learning how to write instructions using complex vocabulary in English. In science we have learnt about astronomers who believed in heliocentric and geocentric theories about the planets.

<u>Year 6:</u> This week in Year 6, we have been looking at formal verbs and extending our vocabulary using a thesaurus. We have then been using these in our biography writing to create a formal tone and interest the reader. In SMSC, we have recapped the British Values and thought about how we use all of these in our school daily life. In indoor PE, we have begun our new gymnastic unit where we have been linking our gymnastic moves and rolls with smooth transitions.
