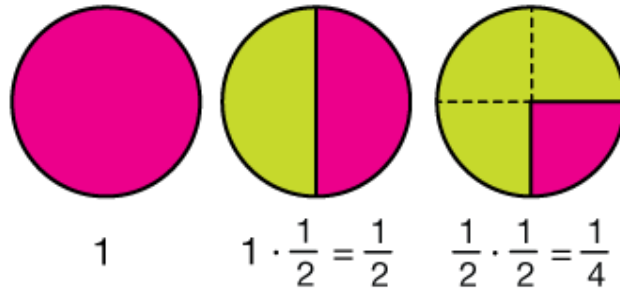

In Maths, we have been looking at teen numbers and making representations of them with Numicon and ten frames. In literacy we have just started our new book called Handa's hen . In this story Handa is very worried at the beginning but has a wonderful surprise at the end.**



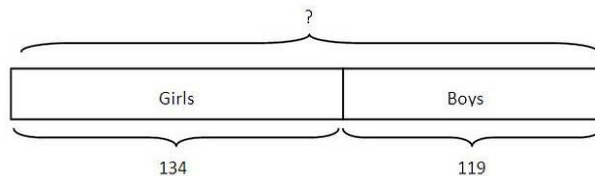
**Year 1: this week, we have been looking at finding a half and a quarter of an object or a quantity in Maths. We used different objects to share into equal groups of 2 or 4. The children worked really hard on understanding the concept.**



**Year 2:** we have been working hard completing practice tests ready for our SATs over the next two weeks. Our scores have really improved and we are ready for the challenge!



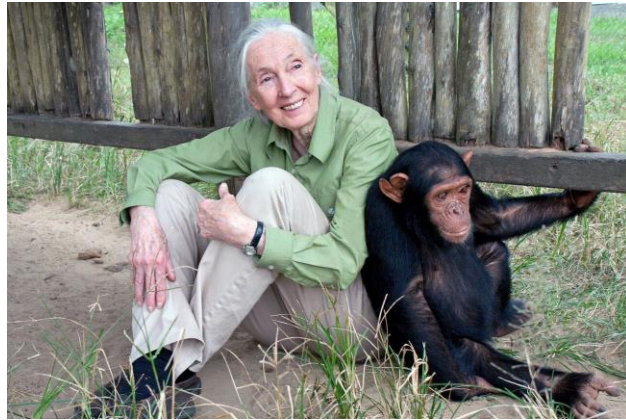
**Year 3:** in Maths lessons, we have started our second unit on fractions. We have been adding and subtracting fractions and reminding ourselves about the importance of the whole. We have also been using bar models to help find unit fractions and non-unit fractions. It has been lovely to see everyone challenge themselves and use reasoning skills to solve tricky problems.



**Year 4:** we have been working hard in Maths learning about decimals – they have been amazing! In English we have started our practising writing. The children have contributed excellent ideas to our class story.

**Year 5:** this week we have been learning to use language such as parralled and perpendicular when describing shapes, lines and angles in Maths. In Science, we have learnt about the work of Jane

**Goodall- the British scientist who has studied the chimpanzees for over 60 years. In RE, we learnt about the message Jesus was trying to share when he gave his sermon on the mount.**

## Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

### Do you know your child's attendance ?

95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.

90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.

Lateness = Lost Learning

- **5** Minutes late each day - **3** days lost
- **10** Minutes late each day - **6.5** days lost
- **15** Minutes late each day - **10** days lost

We have returned from the Easter break to a very busy Summer Term.

Firstly, I hope that everyone enjoyed the Bank Holiday weekend and the associated coronation celebrations.

WeST, as a family of schools, has hosted several Ofsted inspections across our primary and secondary schools, in fairly rapid succession. Whilst we note that there is always work to do and improvements to be made, we are extremely pleased to read the positive validation of our work and the richness and quality of education from which our children benefit. I will take a moment here to specifically recognise the achievement of Glen Park Primary School at being judged 'Outstanding' in all categories by Ofsted in its recent inspection.

Further good news:

Congratulation letters have been received from the Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP, Minister of State at the Department for Education:

- Yealmpton Primary School for achieving 100% in Phonics Screening Check (PSC) – Year 1. Top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country, a brilliant result for the children and staff.
- Three of our schools, Plympton St Maurice Primary School, Morley Meadow Primary School and Wembury Primary School also received letters acknowledging the wonderful performance of their children in last summer's Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). These schools were recognised as being in the top 200 schools nationally.

Quite some achievement given that there are nearly 18000 primary schools in England!

I now wish to inform you of forthcoming leadership changes at three WeST schools.
