The children have completed their star tests this week, ready for their new targets to be set for after half term.

Over half term there is an Argyle roadshow on Wednesday 31st May - there are still the last couple of places available, you can either book online or come to the office to pick up a form.



Foundation: we have talking about what makes a good friend in Jigsaw and we have talked about who our friends are and why they are our friends. In Maths we have been sharing groups of objects fairly and noticing that if we add two equal groups together it makes a double. #### Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

#### Do you know your child's attendance?

95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.

90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.



# 5 minutes late, does it really matter?



Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

- 5 Minutes late each day 3 days lost
- 10 Minutes late each day 6.5 days lost
- 15 Minutes late each day 10 days lost

- 20 Minutes late each day 13 days lost
- 30 Minutes late each day 19 days lost
