Dear Parents/Carers,

This week the temperature has dropped but luckily the rain has steered clear of playtimes so we have been able to get out in the fresh air, please ensure your child has a warm coat in school at all times and please put a name on it! Despite the colder weather outside, the children have been working hard as always, please see below for what they have been learning this week.

As you can see, the wall is now fixed, so there shouldn't be any more mud on the path for you to jump over in the mornings! However, we will have to wait until the Christmas holidays to get the path resurfaced. Thank you for your understanding.

Calling all keen artists! Cool Milk is running a design a Christmas card competition - If you would like to enter this competition, please fold over a piece of A4 paper and draw your best Christmas design with a milk theme! Year 2 - after the Christmas holidays we have been offered 6 weeks of road safety training for the children by Plymouth road safety officers. This will consist of small groups, learning about in the local area for around 30 minutes a week, accompanied by 3 road safety officers. Please read the leaflets that your child has brought home today and if you are happy for your child to take part in this opportunity, complete the road safety training consent by 8th December. As you know, the roads around our school are dangerous with speeding traffic and this will support them to notice road hazards - this is not designed for them to walk independently, but to be more aware of what is going on around them.

Unfortunately, as there have been no volunteers to take on the PTA, we have had to close it down. This means there will be no Xmas Fair this year and no further fundraising for the year 6 Prom and the gym trail we have planned for the area next to the playground where the hut has been demolished. If you are interested in finding out how to become a member of the PTA then please come to see me, it really isn't a lot of time throughout the year, just a couple of discos, an easter egg hunt and a Christmas & Summer fair. It is ideal for a few parents who are friends to get together and organise. We can support as a school, but we can't do it all ourselves.

Social Media - yet again we have had to deal with upset children in school due to the use of Social Media outside of school, please monitor your children's use of their mobile phones & other devices and make them aware of the consequences of sharing their own (or anyone else's) personal information & pictures on Social Media. The age of criminal responsibility in England, Wales and Northern Ireland is 10-years-old; if a complaint is made to the police, children could be investigated and if the behaviour is found to be illegal, the consequences for anyone 10 or older could be worse than they have considered when sharing in a group chat. The legal age for using Snap Chat is 13 years old and we strongly advise against any child in our school using it.

Xmas dinner forms - these were sent out earlier this week, thank you to the 64 people who have already got theor orders in. The deadline for completing them is Thursday 30th November and no further orders can be taken after this date.

Xmas play booking forms - these were sent out today - please complete them by 4th December for a chance to see your children's acting skills on show! Due to fire safety rules, we must have a register of everyone coming and won't be able to let anyone in on the day without pre-booking.

Foundation: this week we have been exploring part whole models in Maths; we have learnt how to separate numbers into parts. In English, we have tried out being the three little pigs and described how we have felt at different points in the story. We have also been thinking about who we talk to in class if we have a problem in our Jigsaw lessons.



Year 1: we have innovated our story of the three little pigs and decided our new characters are three cheeky blackbirds. As we write our new story we are underlining capital letters with red pencil and

underlining our past tense verbs with green to help us remember key parts of our sentences. In Jigsaw we have continued to explore what bullying means and who we can talk to if we have a problem.



Year 2: we have begun our preparations for our nativity performance. The class has been rocking with the sound of us learning the songs! We are already getting excited!



Year 3: this week we have been practising our writing for our English unit. We have also planned our stories ready to write next week!



Year 4/5: have been exploring melting points in a science experiment and year 5 have been learning about metamorphosis. The class have also wowed me with their growing knowledge of French words! Très bien!





Year 6: this week we have been writing a shared story about an adventure for Chitty. We have travelled back to WW2 and really focused on our dialogue to show the different characters' personalities. In History, we learned about the oldest story known – The Epic of Gilgamesh and discussed the different themes of the story as well as our favourite parts. In one of our PE lessons, we are learning how to play Kwik cricket. We are all becoming very accurate with our bowling technique and are scoring lots of points by hitting the stumps.

Social Media



We are increasingly having to deal with issues at school that are actually from inappropriate or unkind use of social media. Please check your child's mobile phone daily to monitor the messages they are sending and receiving, particularly the language they are using. This is a parent's responsibility rather than a school one, we can educate them but not monitor their devices. The legal age for having all social media apps e.g. Wink, Snap Chat, Facebook, Instagram, etc. is 13 years old - no child in our school should be using them.

Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

Do you know your child's attendance?

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95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.
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90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.
