Wednesday 6th December is Christmas Dinner Day - please come to school in your most festive Christmas jumper!


Xmas play tickets will be coming home next week; please keep them somewhere safe as you will need to bring them to the performance you have been allocated.

Foundation: this week we have been so impressed with how well the children have engaged with our nativity rehearsals. We have also been practising anti-clockwise circles to form letters including a,d,c,e and g. In understanding of the world, we have been describing materials using feely bags and key vocabulary, such as hard, soft and transparent.



Year 1: the children in Year 1 have also really impressed us with their listening skills in our nativity rehearsals. In English we have been innovating the story by changing the three little pigs to new characters including three cheeky little cars and three funny fairies. In Science we have been trying out key vocabulary to describe properties of materials. The children particularly liked describing materials as opaque and absorbent.



Year 2: this week year 2 have a very exciting visitor into class from the Peninsula Dental School. The lady taught us all about keeping our teeth clean and why it is so important. She even had a little goodie bag for us with various things to help us give our teeth a good clean morning and evening.



Year 3: this week the children have been writing their final drafts for their versions of Grendel – A Cautionary Tale About Chocolate. The children have also planned their animations in computing. I look forward to this being made so I can share them with you.



Year 4/5: the children have been learning more about mountains and how they have been adapted by humans. Year 4's have been working hard on their multiplication facts and year 5 have been focusing on ordering fractions.



Year 6: this week we have written our own adventure stories for Chitty – they really are amazing! In art, we have been looking at different techniques involved with monochromatic art; we have some budding artists in the class. In Gymnastics, we got out all of the equipment and demonstrated our

This is a parent's responsibility rather than a school one, we can educate them but not monitor their devices. The legal age for having all social media apps e.g. Wink, Snap Chat, Facebook, Instagram, etc. is 13 years old - no child in our school should be using them.

Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

Do you know your child's attendance?

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95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.
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90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.

5 minutes late, does it really matter?



Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

- 5 Minutes late each day 3 days lost
- 10 Minutes late each day 6.5 days lost
- 15 Minutes late each day 10 days lost

- 20 Minutes late each day 13 days lost
