





































































































Foundation: Children have enjoyed reading the non-fiction text 'Hot and Cold'. They have had fun exploring ice during child-initiated play, there were lots of discussions on how to melt the ice. They decided the best way to do this was to add warm water. They also each wrote a lovely simple sentence about one of the photographs from the text.



Year 1: Children have continued to learn about 'The weather' in science. This week we investigated rain, the children used non-fiction texts to deepen their understanding to why it rains. They then enjoyed following step-by-step instructions on how to make a rain gauge of their own. We placed the


rain gauges in the Foundation playground and checked them at the same time every day and recorded the results.



Year 2: The children have finished their Walkwise sessions. They have loved learning all about road safety and will really miss getting out and about on a Tuesday morning.



Year 3: In SMSC, our Healthy Me! unit has allowed us to consider how the calories we get from the foods we eat provide us with the energy we need to work, grow, and exercise. We also discussed the importance of exercise to stay healthy and understand that for our bodies to be in balance (healthy) we need to take in the right amount of energy and do the right amount of activity. Did you know, we should all exercise for at least 1 hour *every* day?



Year 4/5: This week the children have been learning more techniques to improve their descriptive writing skills. During Jigsaw they have continued their 'Healthy Me' unit by learning about first aid. The children had a brilliant time in the hall learning how to get their partner correctly into the recovery position. Well done everyone!



Year 6: In Year 6, we have begun our tennis unit in PE and carried on with our Rugby unit also. We are showing great independence as well great independent skills. In English, we have begun writing our class explanation on The Tellyscope, invented by the ingenious Wallace and Gromit. In Maths, we have had to show pure perseverance with line graphs, which we found tricky at first. I have been really proud of all of Year 6's resilience this week – we have upped our revision in preparation for SATs and they are rising to the challenge!



#### 5 minutes late, does it really matter?



Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

- 5 Minutes late each day 3 days lost
- 10 Minutes late each day 6.5 days lost
- 15 Minutes late each day 10 days lost

- 20 Minutes late each day 13 days lost
- 30 Minutes late each day 19 days lost

#### Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

#### Do you know your child's attendance?

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95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.
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90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.
