Foundation: the foundation children have worked very hard 'counting back' in maths this week; they have been using number lines to support their learning.

Year 1: the Year 1 children have been really stretching their brains by exploring different amounts in groups during our maths lessons.

This week Foundation and Year 1 children have started their new science topic 'Plants'. They were all very excited on Thursday afternoon to plant their very own sunflower seed. We talked about how to care for the seeds and will be keeping a weekly record of our observations.



















Year 2: for this term's 'Creating Music' computing unit, Year 2 were listening to music and learning to describe rhythm and pulse. We then visited a website called 'Chrome Music Lab: Rhythm' where we were able to create rhythms using digital instruments. We could choose from 3 instruments each time in order to create our rhythm. We could then play our piece of music back and make any changes to improve it. We discussed which rhythm was our favourite and why.



Year 3: in Science, Year 3 have started their new unit on 'Animals including Humans'. Last week, we started looking at the skeleton, naming bones from the human body. This week, we carried out an investigation. The big questions were: Do people with longer legs jump further? Do people with longer arms throw further? We worked together to find out the results – please ask your child what they discovered!

Year 4/5: this week Year 4/5 were amazing on our local walk to Efford Marsh. We were linking our walk to our class text 'Where My Wellies Take Me' and were preparing for writing our recounts next week. They showed fantastic engagement and were super representatives of Austin Farm Academy when we met members of the public! I was very proud of them.











Year 6: in Year 6 this week we have achieved AMAZING arithmetic scores; these are a result of our hard-work, resilience and perseverance over the last couple of months. In Art, we enjoyed making our personal hearts to go on the school display and exploring plant structures; we are looking forward to creating sculptures near the end of the unit. Two more weeks until SATs!

Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

- 5 Minutes late each day 3 days lost
- 10 Minutes late each day 6.5 days lost
- 15 Minutes late each day 10 days lost

- 20 Minutes late each day 13 days lost
- 30 Minutes late each day 19 days lost

Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

Do you know your child's attendance?

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95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.
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90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.
