













Foundation: the foundation children have worked very hard 'counting back' in maths this week; they have been using number lines to support their learning.




Year 1: in Year 1 this week the children have really enjoyed the new maths unit 'Fractions'. They have been finding half and quarters practically and by shading 2D shapes. In English they have worked together to create a class version of 'Oi Frog' and at the end of the week started to invent their very own version!



Year 2: in one of our English lessons this week, we generated ideas for our own Traction Man adventure. We needed to visit different locations in the school, turn an everyday object into a bad character, and then decide what problem that character would create in our story. Finally we needed to plan how Traction Man was going to resolve the problem, and in true Traction Man style, 'save the day!'. Miss Brokenshire and Mrs Parker were very impressed with not only how imaginative we were, but how enthusiastic towards the lesson we were.



Year 3: the children have been very busy this week using what they have learned in the current English unit in some 'short burst' writing. We have been working on expanded noun phrases and using adverbs, adverbial phrases, and adverbial clauses for 'when' and 'where'. The children really impressed me with their exceptional work, and I am very proud of what they have produced. Next week, we are going to start planning and writing our own stories. I'm sure they are going to be fabulous!



Year 4/5: this week the class have been learning more about how to engage safely with different online communities and how to recognise dangers online. We had brilliant fun in PE. Our new dance

unit is dance styles and this week we were trying out some moves from 1950's rock and roll! Everyone tried so hard!

Year 6: in Year 6, we have been preparing for our SATs. We are in full revision mode and the children are displaying resilience and perseverance skills in abundance. In SMSC, we have been looking at positive and negative examples of people having power and control. The children have participated in some really grown up conversations and have shown they understand these concepts.

5 minutes late, does it really matter?



Lateness = Lost Learning

(Figures below are calculated over a school year)

- 5 Minutes late each day 3 days lost
- 10 Minutes late each day 6.5 days lost
- 15 Minutes late each day 10 days lost

- 20 Minutes late each day 13 days lost
- 30 Minutes late each day 19 days lost

Attendance.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a child's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. We are implementing new procedures to help parents get their children to school.

Do you know your child's attendance?

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95% Attendance - 2 whole weeks of school missed.
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90% Attendance - 4 whole weeks of school missed.

85% Attendance - 6 whole weeks of school missed.

80% Attendance - 8 whole weeks of school missed.

75% Attendance - 9 plus whole weeks of school missed.
