## Accelerated Reader

## Accelerated Reader is a new program designed to do the following things:

1) Find books that are the right ability for your child;
2) Encourage your child to read more;
3) Improve your child's reading ability.

## STAR Reading

A computer-adaptive reading test used to assess pupils' reading ability and to determine their recommended reading levels for Accelerated Reader. Measures growth over time.

## Accelerated Reader

A database of a quizzes to test comprehension of books read. Provides instant feedback and monitoring.


At the start of the program, pupils will take a Star Test, which is a computer-based test that measures a student's reading ability through a series of 34 questions.

Every test for every student is different and the computer selects different questions for each student dependent on how well they answer the previous questions. Essentially, the computer adapts the test to suit your child.

Children need a sight read of $100+$ words to enable them to move past the practice part of the test.

## How STAR Tests Work

1) The student must take their time. It is recommended that each child should spend at least 20 minutes on their tests.
2) Students should not guess answers to questions. Instead, they should wait for the question to time out. This is to ensure the computer is not given a false impression of the student's reading ability.
3) Star Tests are done independently in school.
4) 45 seconds per ? Moving to 90 s as the test progresses.

## $3.0-3.9$ ${ }_{\text {Highest }}$ <br> number

After each Star Reading Test, children are given a ZPD range, which is two numbers that the pupil uses to choose their next reading book.

The lowest number is the lowest level of book the pupil should be choosing.

The highest number is the highest level of book the pupil should be choosing.

The teacher will place a new sticker in the Reading Record to show what level the child is on.

A new STAR test takes place every half term, so students can see improvements in their reading ability, but also choose more challenging books.
Teachers regularly check the quizzes completed after each week so that children are kept on challenging texts and are not 'coasting'.

## AR Books and ZPD

AR Books - Each quizzed book has a book level which represents the difficulty of text

ZPD - An individual range of book levels recommended for each pupil's reading ability

## OAccelerated Reader Quizzes

A quiz is taken after a book has been read. Ideally this needs to be taken within 24 hours of reading. To take a quiz, children can only access in school as our settings have been set to school day hours only. To access go to the same login as Star Tests but click on Accelerated Reader. Enter the book/quiz no. or other and they can take the quiz.

There are usually about 10 multiple choice questions on the book. At the end of the quiz the pupils are given a percentage to show them how well they have done. Generally they need a pass rate of $60 \%$ or higher to earn the points.

Points are based on pro rata basis depending on how well they do on their reading comprehension quiz.

Some vocabulary practice quizzes can be taken as well.

There are some important rules for taking quizzes:

1) The quiz should take place within 48 hours of finishing the book if possible.

## How Much Should A Child Read Each Day?

- According to Renaissance Learning's research, children who read at least 20 minutes a day with a $90 \%$ comprehension rate on AR quizzes see the greatest gains.
- Children should have at least 20 minutes set aside for reading during day.

## How Can Parents Help?

- As with anything, performance improves with practice.
- Encourage a child to read at home.
- Create a culture of reading in your household by reading with your child, starting a home library, visiting your local library, charity shop or bookshop on a regular basis and by letting your child see you reading.
- When reading with a child, stop and ask questions to be sure your child comprehends what they have read and in general make a habit of discussing books that each of you has read.


## How Will Parents Know How Their Child Is Progressing?

- Parents can access their child's AR information in Renaissance Place Home Connect from any web-enabled computer.

- Once in the programme, they can view their child's progress towards targets, points and books read.
- They can also access AR BookFinder to search for titles of interest.
