Welcome to Year 1

English

In English, our first text will be 'How do you feel?' by Patrick George. The main outcome of this unit is to create a short book that includes simple images and sentences describing how we feel and asking someone else how they feel. Our second text this half term will be 'Dear Mother Goose' by Michael Rosen whereby we will exploring a range of well known nursery rhymes. We will write a letter to a character from a nursery rhyme.

PΕ

Our outdoor PE unit will be a Multiskills unit led by Plymouth Argyle Football Club. For our indoor sessions, we are focussing on a gymnastics unit called 'Jumping Jacks'. Children will choose 2 or 3 different jumping actions and link them together to make a short movement phrase on the floor and apparatus.

Maths

This year, the school will be following a successful scheme of learning called Power Maths. Our first unit focuses on numbers up to 10. We will learn to sort and count objects to 10, represent numbers to 10, count one more and one less, count backwards from 10 to 0, compare and order numbers and learn to use a number line. There will be lots of opportunities for strengthening learning when children are finding concepts difficult, and deepening activities, when children require further challenge.

Handwriting

In year 1, children are required to learn about the following four handwriting families.

- *long ladder
- *curly caterpillar
- *one armed robot
- *zig zag monsters We will begin with the long ladder family (l, l, j, u, t, y).

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Religious Education

Our RE topic for the term is titled 'What does it mean to belong to a faith community?'. Children will make links between groups they belong to and those that specific faiths belong to. There will be a focus on symbols and celebrations linked to Islam and Christianity. There will be lots of opportunity for children to develop their oracy skills.

Science (topic)

Our topic this term is science based, Animals including Humans. We will look at naming, drawing and labelling parts of the human body, as well as investigating the five senses. Children will learn about different animal groups, animals we eat and animal body parts. We will touch upon weather and seasons throughout the year, with autumn being covered this term.

Art/Design Technology

A number of this term's art/DT activities will be covered as part of our continuous provision which is a similar set up to Foundation's provision. Children will be making their own colour monsters, creating our own mythical beast, designing a garden for Mary Mary using colours, patterns, textures, line, shape, form and space to represent emotions. Nature objects and straws will be used to create skeletons of the human body.

Music:

Our music this term is called 'Hey You!. All the learning in this unit is focused around a hip hop song called Hey You! We will be listening to and discussing the following songs throughout the unit.

- *Me, Myself And I by De La Soul
- *Fresh Prince Of Bel Air by Will Smith
- *Rapper's Delight by The Sugarhill Gang
- *U Can't Touch This by MC Hammer

- Book Bag Book (changed by RWI teacher). Identify when this book has been read 3 times.
- Oxford Owl (online book and quiz, set by RWI teacher) log ins can be located in the front of your child's diary
- Library book (read to your child by an adult) to develop comprehension and a love of reading. We will aim to change these every Friday
- Record all reading in your child's diary. If your child reads at least 3 times a week, they will move up on our class reading trail. For each multiple of 6, they will receive a certificate in our school celebration assembly.


